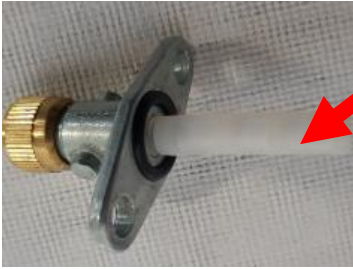


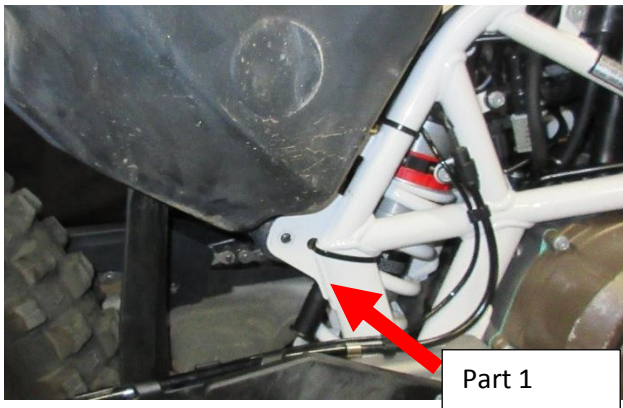
Big Bike Adventure Tours

Fitting KTM style petcock into Husky 701 tank.

- First take tap and remove filter, it unscrews.



- Ensure you drain all fuel out of the Tank, you will still need something under the bike to catch the fuel that runs out when you drill.
- Remove both side covers and muffler
- The bottom tank mounting bolt is also the mounting for the end of the exhaust header pipe. Remove this via these steps.
 1. Remove RH side bolt 10mm head 8mm thread part 1
 2. Using a fully threaded 8mm bolt at least 60mm long screw a nut onto this bolt. You now have a long 8mm bolt with a nut screwed up the thread about half way.
 3. Screw this long bolt into the position you removed the bolt from in step 1 screw it in around 10mm.
 4. Screw the nut down the bolt until it locks up against the frame tighten with a spanner.
 5. Remove opposite side bolt from exhaust bracket.
 6. Loosen the nut on long bolt while holding head of bolt, once loose remove by hand.



- Loosen top mounting bolts and slowly raise the tank once you have it up as high as you can (careful not to stretch the wiring) tie off to handle bar with strap.

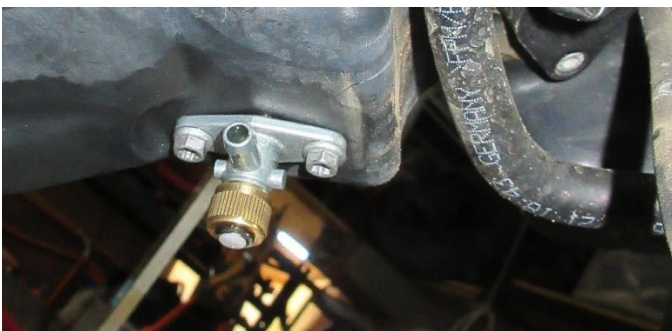
Fitting KTM style petcock into Husky 701 tank.



- You will now see the 2 threaded holes on the front side of the tank and an indent where the hole is to be drilled.



- Using a cordless drill and a 6-7mm bit at very slow speed drill the indent in the centre of the 2 holes.
- Careful fuel could run out if you have not drained it, once hole is drilled make sure there is no rough around the edges.
- Take 2 x 6mm bolts around 10mm long and screw into holes to ensure they are clear and don't bottom out on dirt.
- You can now install tap making sure the o'ring is in place on the face of the tap. (don't tighten the bolts to tight you only have to compress the o'ring. Tap outlet should face away from exhaust



- Run hose from tap around back of shock to connect to front tank.
- Put back together in the reverse you pulled apart.
